Program Description: The externship is an opportunity to gain experience in neuropsychological assessment, as well as psychotherapy (optional). The training experience provides an introduction to the purposes and uses of neuropsychological evaluation. A year-long neuroscience course provides a framework for conceptualization of cognitive impairments. Both inpatient and outpatient populations are served. Students receive training in neuropsychological assessment that includes administration, scoring, interpretation, and report writing. In addition, didactic seminars and lectures attended with the interns and post-doctoral fellow are an integral part of the training experience.

Intervention and Assessment:

- Intervention Training Experiences: 1 individual psychotherapy case, if desired
- Assessment Training Experiences: Adult neuropsychological and psychological testing for cognitive impairments. Experience with test selection, test administration and scoring, report writing, and case conceptualization. Externs can expect to see approximately one testing case per week.

Supervision:

- Hours/Week of Individual Supervision: At *least* two hours per week
- Estimated Hours/Week of Didactics: 2
- Estimated Informal Open Door “Curbside” Supervision: As much as needed
- Context of Didactics: Seminars, Grand Rounds, guest lecturers, year-long Neuroscience course, and mini-courses related to assessment and psychiatric disorders
